The Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA), representing more than 414,000 members, submits the following comments supporting the establishment of low altitude area navigation (RNAV) routes T-251 and T-272 in the St. Louis area, as proposed in Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Docket number FAA-2007-0060.

AOPA began advocating for the establishment of charted RNAV airways in 2000, as part of the broad effort to move forward with a benefits-driven transition to RNAV. Strategic use of RNAV airways nationwide will reduce the cost of flying and provide aircraft owners more benefits from their Instrument Flight Rules (IFR)-certified GPS receivers.

AOPA appreciates the FAA's commitment to implementation of RNAV T-Routes in the St. Louis area and fully supports the work already in process to expand upon this initiative in other terminal airspace areas.
